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The [Department of Land Resource Management and Agricultural Technology \(LARMAT\)](#), in conjunction with the [African Drylands Institute for Sustainability \(ADIS\)](#), organized a one-day regional curricula review workshop at KARLO Headquarters, Loresho on Thursday 6th September, 2018.

The goal of the workshop was to peer-review a proposed multidisciplinary Regional Masters Programme in "Petroleum Governance and Sustainable Development" (PELIBIGO), as required by the Inter-University Council for East Africa for regional programmes. The curriculum has been developed by the [University of Dodoma](#) in collaboration with [Makerere University](#), [Norwegian University of Science and Technology \(NTNU\)](#) and the [Norwegian University of Life Sciences \(NMBU\)](#). The Programme development process is supported by NORAD under the Energy and Petroleum (EnPe) Programme <https://www.norad.no/en/front/funding/enpe/>.
