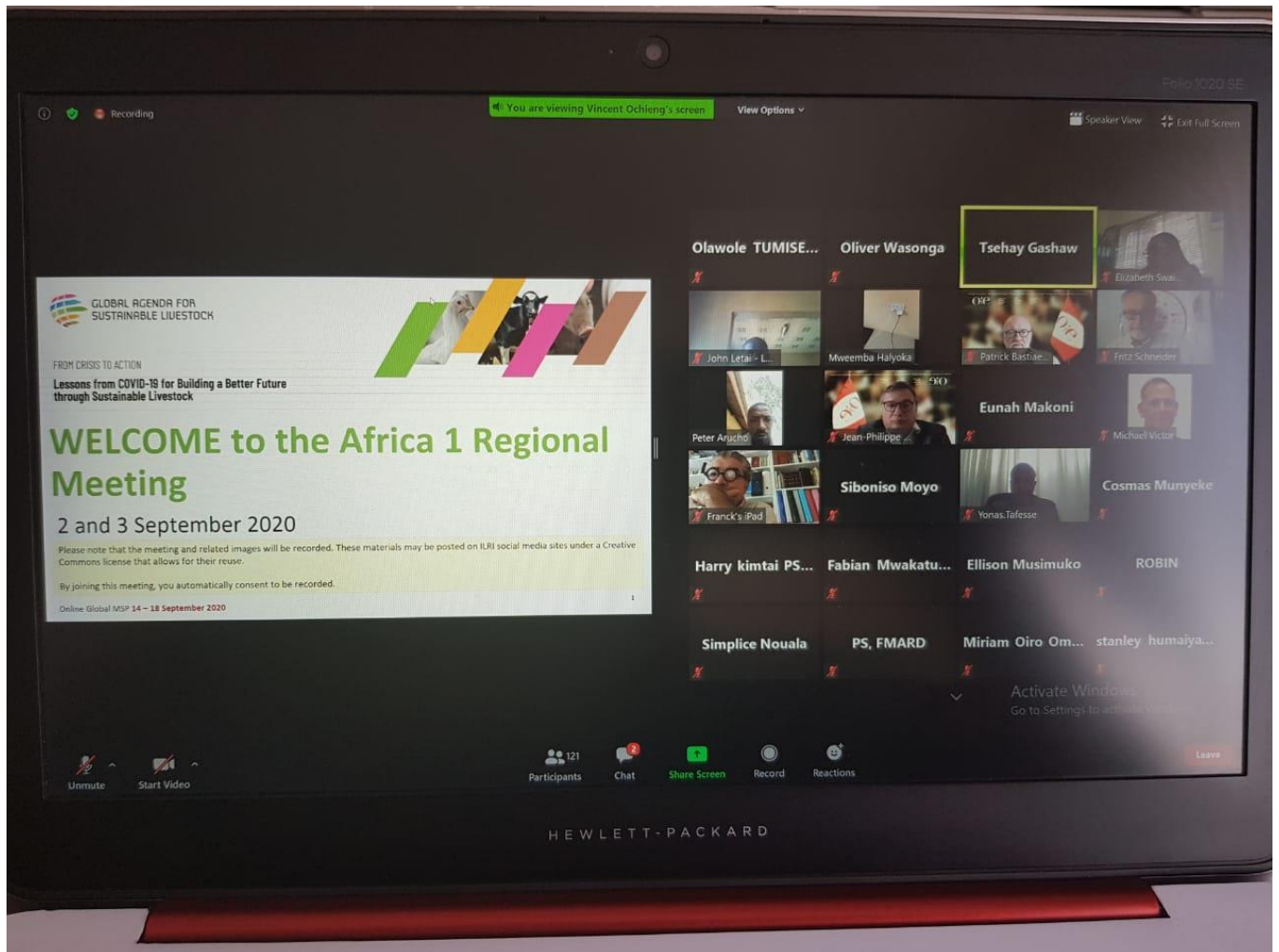


WEBINAR FROM CRISIS TO ACTION; GLOBAL AGENDA FOR SUSTAINABLE LIVESTOCK

GASL Timeline

- 2010 COAG 2010 – the guidance to begin GASL
- 2011-2019 Nine Global MSP Meetings: Brazil, Thailand, Kenya, Canada, Colombia, Panama, Ethiopia, Mongolia and USA
- 2016 Endorsement of GASL's approach and governance structure by the Committee of Agriculture of FAO (COAG)
- 2016-2018 Implementation of an approved Action Plan of GASL
- 2019-2021 Implementation of an approved Action Plan of GASL
- 2020 Development of Theory of Change for the 2022 - 2024 AP of GASL


GASL and the SDGs

- The Global Agenda accepts the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) of the UN Agenda 2030 as its important reference framework.
- While nearly all SDGs are relevant for livestock, the Global Agenda has identified nine SDGs of particular importance for the sector.
