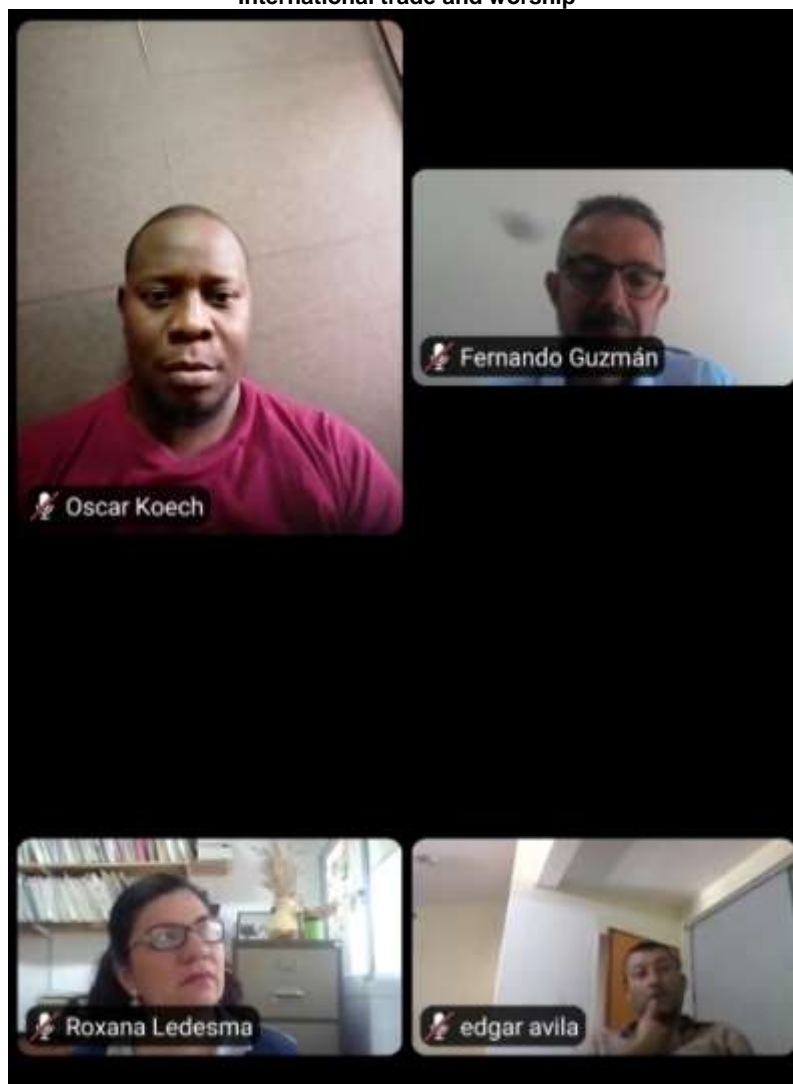

the Strategies applied in the Kenyan DryLands to overcome forage shortages by Bosco Kidake, KALRO Kiboko. From the Brief analysis of the technical presentations and introduction to the questions by Juan Pablo Alberghini, Abraham Sangula revealed that feed shortage is still a big problem to both countries and there is need to develop technologies for feed production and conservation to support the pastoral communities. Climate change has also become a major threat to production systems in sub-Saharan Africa.
